CE INFORMATION

The conference offers up to 19.5 Hours (CH) of Continuing Education approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing, provider number 04269. ON-SITE COVID-19 / SAFETY PROTOCOLS

A COVID-19 self-testing area, located in **Oaktree I**, is available and stocked with rapid self-tests (as long as supplies last) on-site for those desiring to self-check at any time. It is open during all conference check-in / information desk hours.

- A Daily Symptom Checker link is provided through the conference app and all in attendance – participants, presenters, sponsors /exhibitors and staff/vendors – are asked to complete the form each morning of the conference. Anyone with symptoms will be contacted by the CSNO Executive Director.
