MEAL FUNCTIONS AND SPECIAL DIETARY NEEDS

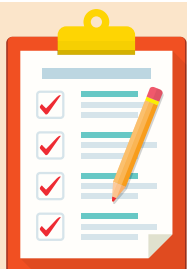

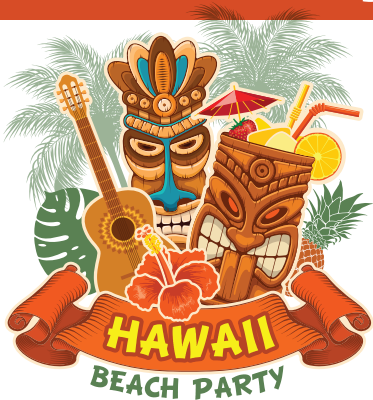


